



Residential ADA accessible parking signs are installed to help assure that a resident has reasonable access to their home. If the request is by a tenant, the consent of the property owner will be required. Residential ADA accessible parking signs will not be installed where they would conflict with required traffic lanes or established safety zones. All other street regulations apply and the resident is not guaranteed exclusive use of the parking. Any vehicle with a valid disability certificate or plate may use the space.

The City of South St. Paul will establish a “ADA Accessible Residential Street Parking Space or Zone” on a public street for a resident who has obtained Disability license plates or a Certificate from the state if the following conditions can be met:

- there must be no available space accommodations on the residential property, *and*
- there must be regular difficulties in finding on-street parking nearby for the disabled resident.

To apply for a sign on the public street in front of your residence, please submit a copy of your disability parking certificate, a map where you propose to have the sign placed, and a written explanation why a disability parking sign is necessary.

The application and site will be reviewed by the City Engineer. If the sign is approved, a fee (to help defray the cost of two posts, two signs, and installation labor & equipment) must be paid. If ownership of the property changes, the City shall have the right to remove the sign(s) as necessary.
